

TRANSGENDER RESOURCE GUIDE

Developed by the CCAD Queer Artist Collective, this resource is designed to provide transgender students resources and information about how to navigate campus life and policies, as well as to review Columbus resources. While this is not an exhaustive list, it's a great starting point for support.

CCAD Resources

- The Queer Artist Collective (QAC) is here to provide community, support, and resources. QAC has weekly meetings students can attend, as well as events such as Queer Prom. You can keep up with us by following us on Instagram @ccadgac or by joining our discord!
- The <u>Student Engagement</u> & <u>Inclusion</u> office at CCAD is here to help create and sustain a welcoming and supportive environment. HOW TO ADD YOUR CHOSEN NAME TO CCAD SYSTEMS

CCAD recognizes that students may choose to be addressed by a name other than their legal name for a variety of reasons. Below are guides on how to change your name on CCAD systems and IDs.

• Moodle, GoMail, and Teams

Within <u>Self Service</u>, the chosen first name is known as "Display Name." Self Service, Moodle, GoMail, and Teams will use the display name on course rosters, grade reports, and your schedule. To change your display name, follow these steps:

- **1.** Log in to your Self Service account at.
- 2. Click on the "My Profile" tab and select "Personal Information".
- **3.** Select "Gender Identity Information".
- 4. Select "Edit" to modify the Display Name.
- 5. Select "Save" to submit the form with your chosen name in the Display Name field.
- **6.** Display Name change requests go to the Registrar and students will receive a confirmation email from the Registrar's Office upon approval. Once approved, it may take up to 72 hours before you see changes.

CCAD Student ID

Current students may have their CCAD Student ID card changed to include their chosen first name. To change your Student ID, follow these steps:

- 1. Complete the Self Service Display Name change process described above.
- 2. Print a copy of the approval email that you receive from the Registrar's Office.
- **3.** Submit the approval email to the Safety & Security Office to request a new Student ID at no additional cost.

Gender identity and pronouns

Current students can identify their gender identity with the college via the Gender Identity Information section on Self Service. To change your gender identity information, follow these steps:

- 1. Log in to your Self Service account at https://ss.ccad.edu/selfserv.
- 2. Click on My Profile tab, select Personal Information, then select Gender Identity Information.
- 3. Select "Edit" to modify Gender Identity.
- **4.** Select "Save" to submit the form with your chosen gender identity selected.
- **5.** Gender identity forms will be reviewed by the Registrar. Once approved, it will appear in the student Gender Identity section of the Self Service student profile only. The college reserves the right to remove a gender identity if it is used inappropriately and/or for misrepresentation.
- **6.** Identifying a gender identity is optional. If you do not complet a Gender Identity Form, your gender identity will be listed the same as your birth sex.

Students may notify CCAD about their gender pronouns by contacting the **Registrar** at registrar@ccad.edu. Upon request, the Registrar will notify faculty members about a student's pronouns that correspond with their gender identity.

LOCATING ALL GENDER RESTROOMS ON CAMPUS

In reflection of CCAD's diverse population, the college has at least one "all gender restroom" in every building, which is a single-occupancy bathroom with a lock on the external door. Students are allowed to use any bathroom they prefer, and all bathrooms have menstruation products provided. HOW TO TALK TO CCAD INSTRUCTORS

Most professors will ask for your chosen name and/or pronouns on the first day of class during attendance tracking. If they do not ask for your name and pronouns, or they change, talk to them inperson or by email, and let them know to how you wish to be referred. You can find their email on your syllabus or on their Moodle page. Here is an example of how to email them:

I am a student in your (insert class name here). HOW TO ADDRESS POSSIBLE DISCRIMINATION

If a professor, CCAD employee, peer, and/or campus organization does not respect your chosen name

or pronouns or discriminates against you or someone else, students can talk to the Chair of their department (which you can find on the CCAD website under Academics), file a report using the BiasIncident Report, or talk to Athena Sanders, Vice President for Student Affairs, Dean of Students & Title IX Coordinator (asanders@ccad.edu).

While it is recommended that anyone considering filing a Bias Incident Report first discuss the issues with the person involved and/or the person's supervisor, we understand this might not always be possible. This step is not required, but ensures the concern has been shared and potentially resolved in a cooperative setting.

Gender Therapists

Gender therapy focuses on the social, mental, emotional, and physical needs of those who are questioning gender, are uncomfortable with aspects of their gender or body, are experiencing gender dysphoria, or are seeking gender-affirming interventions. While CCAD does not have specifically trained gender therapist, you can locate options in the area by visiting the therapy directory psychologytoday.com and use the Issues tab to filter by Transgender in order to find local therapists experienced in that area.

Legal Name and Gender change

Equitas Health and TransOhio hold regular Name & Gender Change Legal Clinics throughout Ohio to help people navigate the name and gender change process.
