PROGRAM SUMMARY

Students will be enrolled in IDS IDUS 3008/FASH 3008 at CCAD during the spring 2018 semester. The off-campus portion of this program will span a ten-day, nine-night period over spring break and will travel to Chile, South America, to sites in and near the cities of Santiago and Valparaíso.

This class will partner with Sitrana, a high-end, handmade Chilean shoe company, to teach students how to research and develop products for customers outside of one's cultural, social, and economic demographic. Participants will develop multiple design concepts and present to the client and potential customers.

The off-campus portion offers a unique opportunity for students to be immersed and explore Chilean culture while conducting demographic research. Additionally, students will have a hands-on experience making their own pair of shoes alongside Chilean cordwainers and cobblers. Students will also get the opportunity to see, first hand, the entire process in the Chilean handcrafted shoe design industry, from the selection of raw materials to the final product.

LOCATION

Santiago is one of the largest cities in Latin America and the cosmopolitan cultural center of Chile. More than 6 million inhabitants live in this capital city, which is also home to many multinational corporations. Valparaíso, a bustling seaport and cultural center on the Pacific coast, was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2003.

PROGRAM COSTS

Students participating in the program will be responsible for a program fee of \$2,849.

The program fee includes:

- Round-trip airfare between Columbus and Santiago, Chile (group flights)
- In-country travel for program activities, tours, factory visits, and entrance fees
- A welcome and farewell meal
- Double- or triple-occupancy accommodations
- International health insurance with medical-evacuation and repatriation coverage
- Materials for shoe design workshop and activities during the in-country portion that will enable each student to make their own pair of shoes.

The program fee does not include:

- Tuition for the three course credits
- Pre-departure expenses (such as passports or vaccinations)
- Travel to and from the Columbus Airport
- Personal expenses
- Most meals (suggested to budget \$250-300)

FEE PAYMENT

If you're accepted into the program, a \$298 non-refundable* deposit to reserve your spot in the program is due on Oct. 30, 2017. The \$298 deposit is applied toward the program fee. The program fee and tuition for the three course credits will be billed with spring 2018 tuition. If a deposit is not made by Oct. 30, the spot in the program will be offered to the next student on the waiting list.

If students withdraw or become ineligible at any time after paying the \$298 deposit, they will be held responsible and charged for any costs the college has incurred on their behalf to secure services associated with this program. Please refer to the withdrawal and refunds policy for more details.

ELIGIBILITY

All students will be required to participate in a pre-departure health and safety orientation organized through the Office of Off-Campus Learning. Failure to do so will result in a student's withdrawal from the program, at which point the student will be subject to the withdrawal and refunds policy described above.

International students who do not hold a United States passport are also required to meet with Jonathan Neeley, Assistant Director of Admissions and International Student Advisor (<u>jneeley@ccad.edu</u>), to discuss their responsibilities and maintenance of their immigration status. International students are required to independently obtain any required visas to enter and exit Chile.

*If there are unforeseen circumstances and CCAD has to cancel the off-campus portion of this program, your deposit of \$298 will be refunded minus any non-program related outstanding account balance owed to CCAD.

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
